## A MESSAGE FROM AMY HAMPTON, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



This year was a pivotal one for our organization. We embarked on important projects with the long-term health and sustainability of the Association at the forefront of our vision. With the support of Community Services Recovery Fund, administered by the Red Cross, we

were able redesign our internal processes and digitize our systems. This was large scale project that has transformed our work, allowed us to purchase office equipment and to ensure data privacy for our members. Automation of many of our of services helps us support our membership.

Looking to the future, we brought five bright and talented young people on board as the new Youth Advisory Council. The YAC has offered valuable insights and fresh ideas on how to reach and best support a younger demographic.

We celebrated the 30th anniversary of DanceWeekend, our flagship event. This was a very special edition of the festival marked by a special look back at 30 spectacular years. With the support of the Ontario Trillium Foundation, we were able to add digital equipment to support our volunteers and audiences at DanceWeekend. The festival brought 350 artists to the stage, shared 10 dance films and offered 3 workshops

to the community. Two world premieres commissioned through our Creative Partnerships program by Madeleine Twyman and BaKari I. Lindsay. The Jacque Foesier Youth Award was given to Tristyn Murray in a special onstage presentation. Audiences joined the event both in-person and online. Wonderful feedback from artists and audiences confirmed the vitality and special place this event holds in our community.

Our International Dance Day celebrations included a special message from Diana Lopez Soto and a Dance Party attended by 2500 participants.

We partnered with the Urban Alliance on Race Relations and the Career Foundation to create work opportunities for four young people for underserved communities.

Our online community continues to flourish. Our Facebook group reached over 12k members and is an active and engaged community. We offered a DanceON series workshop called Social Media 101 to support our members in growing their following as well. We introduced DanceON Chats, an online series highlighting our members with over 1000 views. We continued to advocate for our community and seek out member benefits that support our community.
